Last Sunday's Gospel of the prodigal son called us to reflect upon the times that we feel ourselves outside of God's light; times that we are wayward, profligate, and distant from his love. Christ's Passion and Resurrection invite us to find our home with the Father as we are led to the eternal life promised by Christ's sacrifice.

At Easter Christ's humanity appears in stark relief. He breaks bread with friends; he humbles himself to wash his brothers' feet; he foretells his fate, understanding and accepting the betrayal that must further his Father's plan; he pleads in the garden, *'Let this cup pass me by,'* his darkest hour lighting his human frailty and fear.

Yet with his next breath, submitting his body just as he will his spirit on the cross, Christ offers the keystone of the one prayer he teaches be prayed by all who follow his Father, *'Thy* will be done.'

Christ submits to his Passion, assuring his disciples, *'I am with you always, even to the end of the age.'* We take heart from his promise to the thief crucified beside him, *'Today you will be with me in paradise.'* - an eternal promise embodied by his Resurrection; a promise we pray that we all will hear; God's will be done.

I am pleased to conclude the term with an accompanying letter of reflection on its many blessings.
