In assemblies this week for The Presentation of the Lord, we heard Malachi tell of the Lord announcing a messenger to ready the world for the coming of his son, with St Paul's letter

detailing to the Hebrews Christ's sharing of our body and blood

God knew his message could not be conveyed from afar, decreed from on high. He knew that to invert and upturn the order of the world as was his plan, his son must become one of us, living among, beside, within and as one of us so that we too could each in our own way become like him. Not the constant guide and companion familiar to our community, in the sacrifice of whose son we receive salvation and the promise of eternal life. We pray that we may lead lives that bring us close to being worthy. Only say the word.
