More powerful still were Klopp's final words to a terminally ill fan who recently emigrated to New Zealand, weeks later being diagnosed with incurable illness that left him unable to fly to Madrid to watch his beloved Liverpool in the Champions League Final. Klopp sent a moving video message extending friendship through the shared joy that his players had created throughout the season. As Klopp signed off, in witness as powerful as any prayer, he ended, *'I'm a Christian, so see you.'*

We continue to pray for all students sitting public exams. The mood is buoyant as they enter the halls, and it is a pleasure to be among them to offer prayers and words of encouragement. Many place a crucifix upon their desk, gifted as a symbol of our faith at the Year 11 Mass of Celebration, and still cherished by our Year 13 students. It is fantastic to hear many leave the hall confirming that God was with them. Always and forever, **even until the end of the age.**
