SUNDAY 16TH GOSPEL, MATTHEW 5:17-37

Last week's Gospel calls us to allow our gifts and graces to be light for the world, echoing Isaiah's prophecy that our light will shine like the dawn when we reach out the hand of friendship and love to those in need. St Paul again exhorts the Corinthians to dispense with oratory and philosophy in attempting to discem God's word through scripture. When we do so, the truth of Christ's service and Passion radiates in the simplicity of his greatest commandment, *Love one another as I have loved you.*'

We were pleased last night to welcome parents and carers of Year 9 students for conversations that will help to inform students selecting their option preferences as they look forward to their Key Stage 4 study.
