Dear Parents & Carers

I was pleased on Saturday to represent SJP & Mid Essex Secondary Headteachers at the SOLE demonstration in opposition to proposed library closures across the county. In addition to the organiser, Mr Abbott - a SJP member of staff, the school was represented by many students, parents and staff. At the end of the march our Head Boy Matthew addressed supporters, speaking eloquently about the important role libraries play in the education of young people.

In Harper Lee's *To Kill A Mockingbird*, Scout fears her teacher plans to limit her opportunities to read. She confides in her father Atticus, who eases Scout's fears. Scout later reflects, *'Until I feared I would lose it, I never loved to read. One does not love breathing.'* For Scout, reading is her lifeblood. The school is blessed with many members of staff committed to enriching students' experiences in a variety of ways, including visits to musicals; Chelsea FC; Geography Field visits and foreign language experiences; and GCSE & A Level conferences; last Friday students attended Science Live, hearing a range of world renowned specialists in the field, including Professor Robert Winston.

I know that those enjoying a week on the slopes will return with many fond and lasting memories. As with all who organise such enriching experiences, we thank Mrs Watson, Mr Folkerd, Mr Ashton-Tyler, Miss Hyman & Mr Keylock for their dedication.

I wish all in our community a restful break. We look forward to welcoming the students back to school upon our return.
