**Dear Parents & Carers** 

On Tuesday we welcomed Aid to the Church in Need, a Pontifical Foundation of the Catholic Church, to promote next week's Red Wednesday, when significant buildings around the world will illuminate red in solidarity with the world's persecuted Christians. Students are invited to wear red items to demonstrate support. These can include socks; tights; hairbands, bows & clips; belts; scarves; and trainers. As with all donations, the suggested £2 is voluntary.

Having recently reflected upon the sacrifice of the servicemen and women who fought to free us from tyranny during the twentieth century's conflicts, Red Wednesday sees us reflect upon the freedom we enjoy to witness our faith, and is a further demonstration of the school's long tradition of charitable giving, service and sacrifice.

During assemblies this week students heard speeches from Year 12 Head Boy & Head Girl candidates. All spoke with great poise and confidence, detailing the ways in which they would represent the study body. Our students are our greatest ambassadors, and we are proud of the fantastic contribution their service and commitment makes to our community.

Having written last week of the kindness that characterises our community, I was recently touched by an example whilst at lunch with three Year 9 girls. A Year 7 girl approached, greeting the girls with familiarity and warmth, clearly comfortable in their company. They ate together, and as the elder girls left each made a point of bidding her goodbye.

I asked the girl did she know the girls from primary school. She explained that she had got to know them as not many Year 7 students come to Aquinas for their lunch, and that the girls had noticed her and made her welcome - the SJP spirit at its best.

Yesterday evening we welcomed parents and carers of Year 13 students to our parents' evening - for some families the final such occasion of what have been long and supportive associations. As the young adults who joined us as a new intake six years earlier continue their final months with us in preparation for the next stage in their lives, we reflect upon the responsibility and privilege of supporting young people as they grow to fulfil their potential.

Year 11 practice exams begin on Monday. These will offer much cause for encouragement, demonstrating students' progress towards their potential, and confirming where further effort and support is required. To familiarise students with the experience of collecting their results in August, results will be issued in the Anne Line building during PSHE on Friday 10th January. No results or papers will be issued prior to this date.

I offer a reflection I have shared with students in assembly. During their career a teacher may teach forty Year 11 classes, whereas each student is in Year 11 only once. Students are not defined by their exam results, and we know that education amounts to so much more than grades. However, the coming months are an important period in students' lifelong formation, and their efforts now will aid their future hopes and aspirations.

We look forward to continuing to work with parents and carers to support students to become the best versions of themselves: the people God created them to be.
