Yr7 Students wrote postcards with their own personal messages of hope and prayer. These will be sent to children and families that must face the daily trauma of persecution. 

In November this term St. John Payne were one of six6 schools in Essex invited to take part in an interschool Poetry in Performance competition held at Beauchamps High School in Wickford on Thursday 18th November 2021 at 6.30pm.

Poetry in Performance is an inspiring competition for students to learn and to recite poems by heart, bringing them alive for an audience. The competition was open to Year 7 and 8 students and each school was required to prepare 2 soloist performances and 2 group performances of poems. The hosting school select the theme and the poems and this years' theme was 'Our Changing Globe' with all the poems discussing the planet and the importance of conserving it.

To decide who would represent St. John Payne at the interschool competition, we held auditions at lunchtimes where we saw over 40 students audition their chosen poem either as a soloist or a group. The talent on show was remarkable making our job of selecting the finalists very hard.





Year 8



Year 9




But it's not all about the gifts under the tree It's for those who don't doubt that Christ made us free

If you're feeling stressed, anxious or depressed and want to talk to someone, you can <u>get psycholog-ical therapies on the NHS</u>. They offer therapies like cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT), counselling and guided self-help.

A GP can refer you, or you can refer yourself directly. You'll need to be registered with a GP to get psychological help on the NHS.



Online gaming is hugely popular with children and young people. Annual research conducted by OFCOM shows that gaming is still one of the top activities enjoyed online by 5–16 year olds, with many of them gaming on mobile phones, games consoles, tablets or computers.

Consider games' age ratings

Games, just like films, have age ratings which are regulated by PEGI. These show the age that young people need to be in order to legally buy a game in the UK. PEGI have also created a set of content descriptors which show what content will be seen in the game and give an indication to why it received its rating.

Check who your child is chatting with

Many games have a chat feature which allows gamers to communicate with other players. On some games this is an open chat box where comments can be typed, whilst others may only allow a gamer to select from set phrases. Chat within games can happen publicly, so that other players can see it and interact, or privately in the form of a personal message. Many games also allow you to chat verbally via a wearable headset.

Discuss how to report or block unkind messages

Online bullying can happen in games as well as on social media or messaging apps. It could be through unkind comments or messages, or by targeting other players within in a game. Most games have reporting and blocking features which can be used to support a young person who is being bullied online.
