Year 11 & 13 students have received their practice exam results, and we continue to be impressed with their attitude and approach as they prepare for the summer's public examinations.

It has been nice to welcome visitors to the school in greater number in recent weeks, with a lovely atmosphere at the recent Year 11 parents' evening. As a child's first and most important teachers, we greatly value parental engagement and commitment to our partnerships.

We will review this year's approach to consider how best to collaborate moving forward. Accepting the convenience of online conversations, we are keen to offer opportunity for the more fruitful conversations that are afforded by meeting in person.

Please pass on our sincere thanks to all the students and staff who donated.

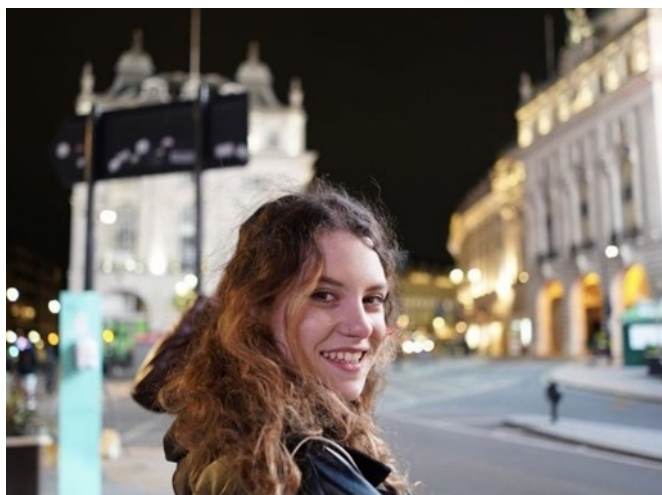

Year 7 bake sale

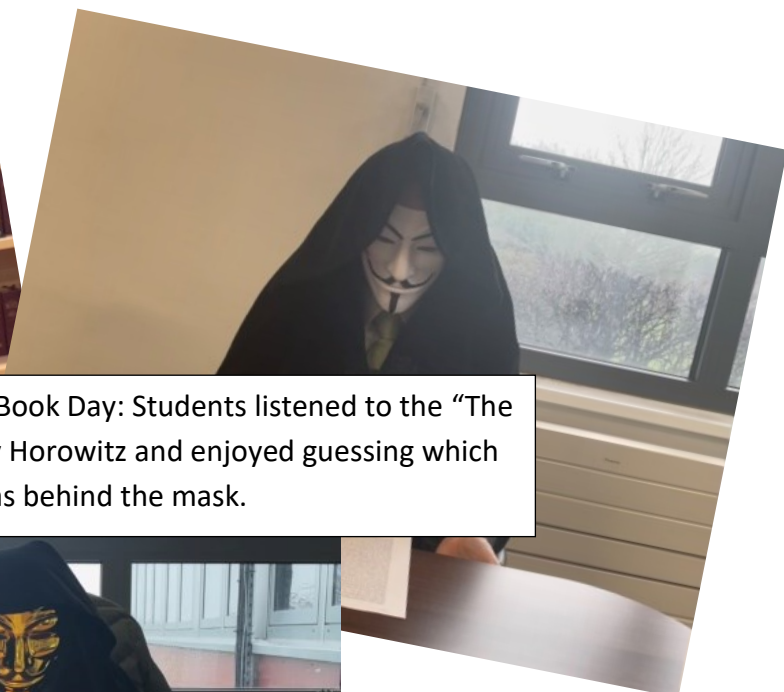

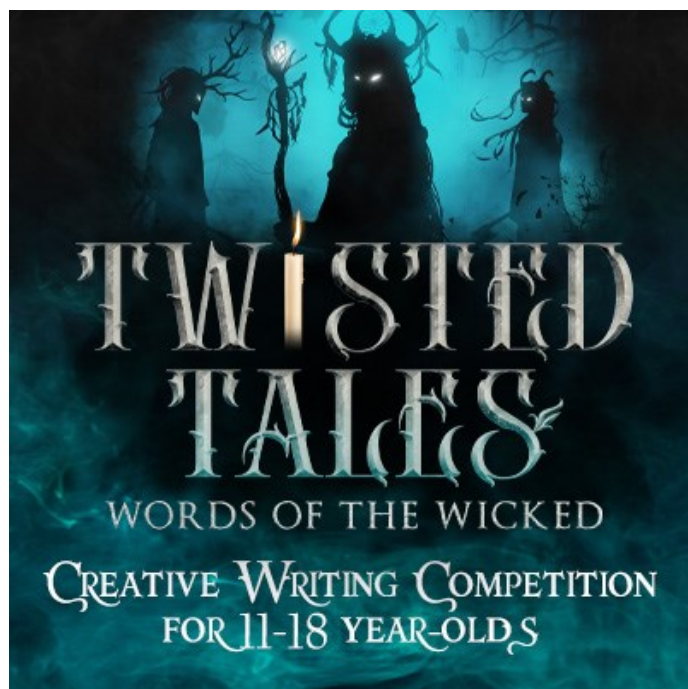
World Book Day
